

WITNESS STATEMENT

Date: 15 August 2018 Incident: robbery

Witness Suspect: Nell Finch Age: 12

The witness first saw the suspect, Alex Flashman, on 23 July 2018. He drove a black car. The witness didn't get a clear view of the passenger in the back seat, but she appeared to be a white female.

Flashman returned the next day and rented an empty warehouse on Branston Road. Over the following three weeks, several large vehicles visited the warehouse and delivered a variety of equipment.
